What does grooming entail?

Grooming involves washing your pup, cutting their fur, brushing them, trimming their nails, and cleaning their ears. While these can all be done at home, a professional groomer will help you develop a regular grooming routine and may be a better choice for breeds with more complex grooming needs.

Nails

Your puppy's nails need to be inspected regularly to avoid them becoming too long and causing discomfort. If they need to be clipped, this can be done with a nail clipper. It's important to be careful not to cut the quick, which is the blood vessel in the nail, so only a very small amount will need to be trimmed while they're young.

Brushing

Brushing your puppy's fur helps to remove dirt and debris and keeps their coat shiny and healthy and helps to prevent matting which can lead to skin irritation. Depending on your puppy's breed and the texture of their fur, how frequently they need to be brushed may vary.

Ear cleaning

Regular ear cleaning helps prevent infections and inflammation and involves using a specialised solution and a soft cloth to gently clean inside the ear. It's important to be gentle when you clean your pup's ears, as the ear canal is very delicate.

Choose your groomer carefully

When choosing a professional groomer for your puppy, it's important to do your research.

Look for a reputable groomer with positive reviews and ask for recommendations from other dog owners. Don't be afraid to ask questions about their experience, training, and handling procedures, as it's essential they're gentle and patient with your pup to make the experience as comfortable as possible.

Socialising your puppy

Socialising your puppy is crucial for their development and wellbeing, and doing so will also help them feel more comfortable and confident when it comes to going to the groomers. Socialisation involves exposing your pup to different people, pets, and situations early on in a positive way, so they feel relaxed when they encounter them later down the line. This can include animals, children, sounds, and environments, but always do so safely and ensure other animals are vaccinated. On top of surrounding them with people and dogs, you may even want to get your pup used to certain sounds, such as a hair dryer, ahead of their first appointment.
