What classifies a dog as small?

Height

Generally, small dogs stand around 25 to 38centimetres tall at the shoulder. Of course, there are some variations depending on the breed, but this gives you a good starting point.

Weight

Small dogs can weigh up to 10 kilograms though their healthiest weight range will depend on the breed. Some can be even lighter than 10kg, like the tiny Chihuahua, while others, like the slightly sturdier West Highland Terrier, might be on the heavier end of the spectrum.

Lifestyle and needs of small dogs

Small dogs might be teeny in size, but they haveimportant needs just as their larger counterparts do.

Treating

Small dogs often have faster metabolisms, so they need a balanced diet that provides all the necessary nutrients. Treats are a great way to reward good behaviour – but watch out that you don't overfeed them.

Training

Training a small dog can be a delightful experience. They're usually quick learners, especially when positive reinforcement techniques are used. Keep sessions short and fun to keep them engaged.

Exercise requirements

Many smallbreed dogs need to be kept on their tiny toes with plenty of activity. Daily walks, playtime, and interactive toys can help keep them fit and mentally stimulated.
